 Mathematician in Spy Case
 Denies Guilt in U.S. Court

BALTIMORE, Sept. 26 (UPI)—Sahag K. Dedeyan, a mathematician accused of cooperating with an alleged Soviet spy, pleaded not guilty today to a charge of failing to report the photographing of a classified document.

United States District Court Judge Alexander Harvey tentatively scheduled Mr. Dedeyan's trial for Oct. 29 and permitted him to remain free on \$20,000 bail. Mr. Dedeyan, 41 years old, answered all questions at the arraignment.

Mr. Dedeyan was arrested June 27 at his home in Rockville, Md., the same day that Justice Department agents in

New York City arrested and charged with espionage his distant cousin and alleged associate, Sarkis O. Paskalian. Mr. Paskalian, 36, pleaded guilty last week in Federal Court in New York to one count of conspiracy to commit espionage.
