

Carter's Panel to Find New FBI Chief

Washington

President Carter announced yesterday that he has chosen the chief executive of the du Pont Co., a one-time Justice Department attorney, to head the search for a successor to FBI Director Clarence Kelley.

Naming the nine members of a search panel, Carter said he has selected as its chairman Irving Shapiro, 60, board chairman and chief executive officer of E. I. du Pont de Nemours and Co., who was an attorney in the Justice Department's Criminal Division from 1943 to 1951.

As promised earlier, Kelley also was appointed to the special committee that will recommend candidates for the FBI post. The group is to meet with Carter today.

Other members are: Associate Justice Susie Marshall Sharp, 69, of the North Carolina Supreme Court; Mary Eleanor Wall, 47, a member of the DuPage, Illinois, county board; Joseph F. Timilty, 38, a Massachusetts state senator from Boston; Judge Cruz Reynoso, 45, of the state Court of Appeal for the Third District in Sacramento.

Mayor Tom Bradley, 59, of Los Angeles; Washington attorney Charles Morgan Jr., 46, former head of the Washington legislative office of the American Civil Liberties Union, and Frederick A. O. Schwartz, 41, a New York lawyer and former chief counsel to the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence.
