F.B.I. Head Says Communists Seek to Exploit Youth in U.S.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2
(UPI)—J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reported today that the Communist party was striving to exploit what it termed a "drift toward the left" among the nation's youth.

In his year-end report to Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy Mr. Hoover said that the youth plan was approved by Gus Hall, General secretary of the Communist party delegates met in Chicago, Ill. to lay the groundwork for a new national youth organization aimed at exploitation of what the party describes as a drift toward the left among young people."

Mr. Hoover said that Mr. Hall stipulated that the youth movement "should avoid the appearance of a Soviet-style organization: however, it should not tolerate anti-Soviet or antiparty thinking."

Mr. Hoover reported action in the domestic intelligence field. He listed the arrest of a New Jersey engineer accused of pass-ing defense contract informa- "one-time" offender.
