Hoover Scores Peace Protests

—J. Edgar Hoover, director of
the Federal Bureau of Investigation, said Wednesday that
most participants in demonstrations protesting United States
involvement in Vietnam were
"halfway citizens." In a letter
to a former F.B.I. employe serving with the Marines in Vietnam, he said: "The small but
highly vocal minority which is
staging these anti-Vietnam demonstrations is, for the most
part, composed of halfway citizens who are neither morally,
mentally nor emotionally mature."
