

LBJ Gets Reports On Protests

SAN ANTONIO (Tex.) — (UPI) — President Johnson received a report from FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover yesterday on "anti-war activity" in the United States.

But the Texas White House would not say whether the report was related to yesterday's demonstrations in New York and San Francisco.

Asked whether Hoover's report raised charges of Communist influence in anti-war activities, White House news secretary George Christian said:

"I can't get into the details of the reports."

He said it was "a regular report" by Hoover on the subject.

"How often does the President get these reports?" a newsman asked. "Whenever Mr. Hoover has anything to report," Christian replied.

"Is it a sheer coincidence that it comes today?" another reporter asked. "I said I wasn't going to get into details of the report," Christian answered. "He gets them on a regular basis from Mr. Hoover."

Christian added that he had announced receipts of such reports in the past. But he said he couldn't remember when. Neither could newsmen.
