
C.I.A. AIDE REQUESTS DISMISSAL OF SUIT

BALTIMORE, Sept. 28 (UPI) —Defense attorneys failed today to have a \$110,000 slander suit dismissed against a Central Intelligence Agency agent who is charged by a former Estonian freedom fighter with calling him an agent of the Soviet secret police.

Federal Judge Roszel Thomson said he would not rule on the motion for a summary judgment for at least a week to give the plaintiff's attorney a chance to study a Justice Department opinion upholding certain privileges of intelligence agents in internal security matters.

The plaintiff, Erick Heine, has charged the C.I.A. agent, Juri Raus, also of Estonian origin, with slander for calling him a member of the K.F.D., the Soviet secret police. Mr. Heine was a leader in the Estonian émigré movement and the Government was trying to discredit him, he charged.

The defense has not denied that the statements were made, but instead has contended that Mr. Raus was privileged to make them within the scope of his duties as a Government agent.
