Bremer

BALTIMORE, Md. AP - A decision on a possible federal trial for Arthur H. Bremer, already convicted of state charges in connection with the attempted assassination of Gov. George C. Wallace, will be delayed until after Labor Day, the U.S. attorney for Maryland said Tuesday.

George Beall said he planned to wait until U.S. District Court Judge Edward S. Northrop returned from vacation in September before considering action on federal charges in connection with the May 15 shooting of the Alabama governor.

"There may well be a trial, or a dismissal of charges or lots of possibilities in between," Beall said.

Bremer, 21, a former Milwaukee, Wis., busboy, was convicted Friday in Prince Georges County Circuit Court on state charges of wounding Wallace and three others at a presidential campaign rally in Laurel, Md. Wallace remains partially paralyzed.

Bremer was sentenced to 35 years imprisonment after being found both sane and guilty in the trial at Upper Marlboro, Md.

Judge Northrop earlier ordered an indefinite postponement of Bremer's federal trial when it appeared that it might conflict with the state trial.

Bremer has been charged by federal authorities with shooting Wallace, a presidential candidate; Secret Service Agent Nicholas Zarvos, and with two violations of gun laws.
