

Bremer Kin Is Jailed in Fraud Case

MIAMI, Aug. 25 (AP)—William Bremer, brother of the man convicted of attempting to assassinate Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace, has been ordered jailed for 18 months after pleading guilty to 178 counts of fraud.

A circuit judge also ordered Friday that Bremer repay about \$80,000 to some 2,000 women who enrolled for courses at weight reducing salons.

Bremer's younger brother, Arthur, was jailed for the attempted assassination of Wallace at a Maryland shopping center in May, 1972.

William Bremer brought \$25,000 in restitution money to court and pleaded for time to gather the rest.

But the judge rejected the plea and ordered Bremer to begin serving the sentence Sept. 14 in the Dade County Stockade on nine of the misdemeanor fraud counts.

The judge also gave Bremer a 60-day suspended sentence and placed him on 15 years' reporting probation on three felony counts and the other 169 misdemeanors.

Defense attorney Ellis Rubin said the name Bremer "worked against" his client.

Hundreds of women called police in March, 1972, and complained that the doors were locked at Bremer's three Figure Form Reducing studio outlets and that all the exercising equipment had been removed.
