

SLIDES SAID TO SHOW U.S. TORTURE IN WAR

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2—A group of Vietnam war veterans continued their efforts today to document charges of widespread murder, torture and terrorism by American forces in South Vietnam.

A former military intelligence agent testified that he had twice seen Vietnamese civilians pushed from Marine Corps helicopters in the air and a former medical officer showed slides of a prisoner allegedly "being given the water torture."

The veterans appeared at the

second day of hearings held by antiwar veterans.

The Defense Department had no specific comment on such hearings, which have been conducted on a smaller scale around the country for the last year. No attempt is being made to present a balanced testimony at the hearing, since the veterans who are running it feel the Government has ample resources to give its point of view.

A Pentagon spokesman noted that the Universal Code of Military Justice required servicemen to report illegal actions when they saw them.
