Dean returned (to WX?) from Camp David, having been sent there 22 Mar to write report on his investigation, according to Ehrlichman.

SFC [NYT] 6 Jun 73

"Hunt, Granted Immunity, Talks to Grand Jury." Hunt at first invokes Fifth Amendment in answers to six questions; taken before Sirica, who grants immunity from further prosecution, sends him back to grand jury; testifies for four hours.

Hunt, taken to court from D.C. jail in handcuffs, is apparently returned there to quarters he shares with the five other defendants. Jail official says he has "no instructions" to find new quarters for Hunt.

WXP 29 Mar 73, Meyer

McCord testifies at 4½-hour, closed-door session of Ervin committee; says under oath that Liddy told him Mitchell had personally approved plans to bug Watergate, etc., etc.; is scheduled to appear again before the committee 4 Apr.

WXP 29 Mar 73, Woodward and Bernstein

Haldeman - "As pressure mounted, the White House took the extraordinary step of quietly sending Haldeman on March 28 to a regular meeting of the Wednesday Club, a group of congresmen whose views were generally sympathetic to Mr. Nixon. Haldeman spoke softly, told them Watergate was being blown out of proportion."

WXP 6 May 74, p. 20, Barry Sussman

- WX Star-News says Haldeman told the group he was personally responsible for organizing a political intelligence-gathering operation last year, but that the project did not involve any illegal activities. KPFA News, WX, reporting on Star-News story: "Haldeman also reportedly told the G.O.P. congressmen that Nixon's political aides had no connection with any illegal activities during the 1972 presidential campaign, but that they had not been effective in presenting their case to the public."
