Hunt's testimony to Watergate grand jury 2 May 73 is given to defense in Pentagon Papers trial. In this testimony Hunt tells of plans to break into offices of Dr. Lewis J. Fielding, Ellsberg's psychiatrist, and says that CIA provided him with camera, false identification papers, etc.
