Byrne suspends court proceedings in Ellsberg trial after government discloses Ellsberg's phone calls had been tapped in late 1969 and early 70, orders government to produce all logs and other records concerning the taps; prosecutor David Nissen reports to the court in the afternoon that those records have been missing from FBI files since some time between July and October, 1971. Judge Byrne sets tomorrow morning as deadline for hearing arguments on wiretap issue as grounds for dismissing the charges.
