"Detroit 13." Original indictment, Jun 70; superseding
indictment 7 Dec 72, after Justice Department conducted
nationwide grand jury proceedings aimed at radicals.
Defendants charged with conspiring to bomb police stations,
government buildings, etc., in various parts of the country.
U.S. District Judge Damon J. Keith is presiding over the case
in Detroit.

Defense had cited several instances (with supporting
affidavits) of break-ins and burglaries aimed at the
defendants, and said they fit the pattern of the 1970 White
House intelligence plan. Today Judge Keith grants defense
motion to schedule hearing requiring several governmental
agencies and the White House to disclose all clandestine
activity directed against the "Detroit 13." Hearing is
scheduled for 24 Sep.

In granting the motion, Judge Keith orders various
governmental units to make full disclosure of any "burglary,
acts of sabotage, mail searches, electronic surveillance
devices, provocateurism, breaking and entering" that were
used against the defendants, their lawyers or SDS or
Weatherpeople offices.

Order applies to the FBI, the CIA, the National Security
Agency, the Departments of Justice, Defense and Treasury,
the Secret Service, the White House and the plumbers unit.
