Theis: "[The President's] decision against furnishing documents appeared to be a reversal of policy. The White House already has furnished some materials to the committee, including logs of 30 to 40 meetings between Nixon and former White House counsel John Dean in the first four months of this year. Dean's successor, Leonard Garment, had implicitly agreed to grant the committee access to substantial additional documents which Senate investigators are seeking to examine and photocopy. Only a few days ago, Garment asked the committee for more time in meeting its request and cited the sheer volume of papers it wanted."
