Butterfield earls Baker, 2 p.m., goes to Baker home (this is a Sunday). Asks if he will be called to testify at polic hearings, is told he would be. Tells Baker he is to leave 17 Jul for trade conference, Soviet Union; Baker says he will call Ervin and tell him of Butterfield's travel plans.

Baker asks Butterfield if he had informed WH of what he had told committee staff; Butterfield says no, Baker says, "Well, you should."

Butterfield tries to reach Garment, but he is out of town; does reach Buzhardt, informs him of what he had told committee staff. When Garment returns, he, Buzhardt and Butterfield discuss the matter by phone in the evening.
