Ervin committee makes public memo from Colson to Haldeman, 30 Mar 72, ~~linking Nixon to~~ warning of existence of other memos which would "directly involve" Nixon in <sup>favorable</sup> settlement of ITT case., and "lay this case on the President's doorstep."

ABC News says Ervin committee has subpoenaed close associates of Rebozo, and quotes "sources close to the Senate committee" as saying Rebozo himself will be called for questioning.

Ervin committee votes to refuse Colson's request that he be permitted to testify before committee recesses; Dash says committee believes Colson should be heard when it deals with political espionage, and that Colson's testimony and those who would have to be heard ~~with him~~ in conjunction with his testimony would ~~not~~ extend the hearings further into August.

Colson memo to Haldeman, 30 Mar 72, made public by Ervin committee; memo is on ITT case, says Nixon could be directly involved, and mentions another memo "alluding to discussions between [Nixon and Mitchell] as to 'the agreed upon ends'" in the case. See also entry 3 Aug.

Memo above was turned over to Ervin committee ~~in~~ during interview by staff this evening; \* ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~  
She was Colson's secretary until he left the WH and kept his financial records and had full access to memos which went out from his office; when he left he found job for her as confidential assistant to Peter Brennan, Secretary of Labor. No reason given for her possession of this memo; Colson tells Evans and Novak she took the memo home as a "souvenir" of her days in the WH.
