Motorcade route changed because Secret Service said it had learned of a "possible conspiracy" to assassinate Nixon, who is reported to have agreed to the change in the route. First reports name Edwin Gaudet as a member of this conspiracy – he had allegedly made a threat in a bar to kill Nixon – but New Orleans police superintendent and Secret Service very soon say the cases are unrelated. e

He turns suddenly from those escorting him, walks back until he reaches Ziegler, puts both hands on his shoulders and angrily spins him around and gives him a hard shove, saying, "I don't want any press with me - and you take care of it."
