Tapes - Higby testifies in tape hearings about a phone conversation with Haldeman, then in California; no indication who initiated call. Says that in this confersation, 14 Nov, around noon, Haldeman (WXP's wording) "told him of the missing [184-minute] segment." Implication of Post's story is that Haldeman already knew of the gap in the tape. ** Higby: "I think he said it had been caused by Miss Woods." Higby says Haldeman might have first mentioned it to him in the course of another phone call on the evening of 15 Nov, but says he thinks it was "the day before." **

In the call of 15 Nov Haldeman instructed Higby to get Haldeman's notes for 20 Jun from Room 522, EOB, where they are kept with other sensitive Watergate-related files, guarded by the Secret Service.* (Post says this indicates Haldeman still has control of his files at the WH seven months after his resignation.) Haldeman's instructions were for Higby to see Haig before getting the notes, but not to give WH officials any of the notes without first reporting back to Haldeman with a summary of what they contained. Higby says he followed these instructions, that when he read the notes to Haldeman, Haldeman said "that's no problem," and (WXP's wording) "after getting the go-ahead from Haldeman" he turned the two pages of notes over to Haig and Buzhardt, who by then had arrived at Room 522.

Nixon (health) - Nixon is scheduled to have annual physical examination around mid-December. Dr. Tkach says, in phone interview, that Nixon is "well - except at times I think he's tired."

Dr. Tkach says Nixon has no health problems whatsoever. Asked about report (Newsweek 3 Dec, entry 25 Nov) that Nixon was coughing blood before hospitalization in July for viral pneumonia, says there is "no truth whatsoever" to that report.

Rebozo (Hughes money) - Chester C. Davis, a lawyer for Hughes, turns over to Ervin committee 1,000 hundred-dollar bills, supposedly the same ones given by Hughes to Rebozo and returned by him. These are xeroxed and returned to Davis. Serial numbers will be checked to determine if any were printed after the date in 1970 when Rebozo said he received the second installment.

NYT says Rebozo told Miami Herald (no date) there had actually been 1,001 bills, but Ervin says it is his understanding that only 1,000 had been turned over to the committee by Davis.

Davis's testimony today is before a closed session of the committee; had previously refused to testify except at public session. Meeting is attended by Ervin and Weicker and (a number?) of committee staff members.

Ervin says there is "very little doubt" that Rebozo will be called to testify at a public hearing when they resume after present adjournment.

Nixon (finances) - Rep. John Anderson, one of those present at two-hour WH meeting 3 Dec at which WH lawyers gave a review of Nixon's finances, says Nixon's net worth has tripled since he took office and now stands at about \$1 million. According to Anderson, the lawyers said Nixon's net worth was "in the neighborhood" of \$300000, 1 Jan 68, and about \$988,000, 31 May 73. AP: "Neither of the figures jibes with previous public statements by Nixon aides on the President's net worth. One White House official said this was because of differences in accounting procedures."

San Clemente (security) - Cost of providing security for San Clemente this year appears to be \$1,018,382, of which \$341,382 is estimated budget of San Clemente police for this service, and \$677,000, "annual recurring military costs."

Bryce Harlow and Melvin Laird will be leaving WH positions. Harlow says no date has been set but it will be "relatively soon," and that he is not leaving out of dissatisfaction on his part, that he had a understanding with Nixon that his service would be on a temporary basis.
