Nixon (impeachment, resignation) - Gallup poll (taken 30 Nov through 3 Dec, published today) shows that an estimated seven million people have taken som e form of action, urging that Nixon be impeached or that he resign. This is 5 per cent of the population. Of those questioned in this poll, wm 154 to 35 per cent are against requiring him to leave office.

Nixon (tax deduction) - "President Nixon's intended gift to the American people of his house and grounds in San Clemente could give him another big tax deduction at about the time that the one he claimed for the donation of his prepresidential papers runs out.... The property is currently valued at \$1.3 million by California authorities, for purposes of the property tax, and some public officials in the state have argued that it ought to be valued as high as \$2.9 million. Thus the value of the gift as a tax deduction could range from about \$390,000 to \$870,000." Entire deduction cannot be taken at one time but may be spread over six years. Deed has not yet been drawn up.

Nixon (ITT, milk deal, etc.) - Warren says Wixon still plans to produce full reports on Administration handling of ITT affair, dairy industry contributions and other controversial matters before Congress recesses for a month, beginning probably by the end of the week.
