Mills, Ullman, Burke; four Republicans, Sens. Bennett, Curtis, Reps. Schneebeli, Collier. The two leaders, both in seniority and in influence, are Mills and Long. At least seven of the members are conservative.

Nixon (support) - undated story on Bruce Herschensohn, deputy special assistant to the President, reported to work nearly full time "reviewing messages of support for the chief executive and arranging for selected admirers to visit the President." He says that he has since late October worked up to 18 hours a day at this. Says advertisements such as Rabbi Korff's and various Support-the-President rallies have not been instigated or directly supported by WH. WH officials say there is no organized Administration campaign to help Nixon through Watergate crisis.
