Jaworski (indictments) - In year-end report, Jaworski says that although investigations in various areas are continuing, "the presentation of evidence to the grand juries has progressed to the point that in January and February these bodies will be prepared to consider the matter of returning indictments in a substantial number of major involvements."

Report notes that eight corporations and 12 persons have pleaded guilty to various charges; list does not include the seven convicted of Watergate break-in.

Chotiner - Manchester Union Leader prints front-page retraction of charges it published Apr 73 against Chotiner. Retraction accompanies announcement of out-of-court settlement of his \$3 million libel suit against the paper.

The articles, published 27 and 28 Apr, included allegation that Chotiner had "organized three separate political espionage teams," one of them being (in UPI's description) "the one that was caught in the Watergate offices of the Democratic National Committee."
