Ervin committee subpoenas - Nixon rejects subpoenas for more than 500 tapes and documents, saying that to produce the material would destroy confidentiality of presidential communications, and that disclosure to the committee, "and through you to the public," would impair special prosecutor's ability to prosecute any criminal cases arising from grand jury proceedings.

Ervin says, "There is nothing in the Constitution that gives the President any power to withhold from an authorized congressional committee evidence relating to campaign activity or evidence of criminal wrongdoing by his aides."

Dash says committee will take no immediate action to enforce the subpoenas pending outcome of court case involving the five tapes subpoenaed 23 Jul 73.

WH legal staff is reorganized, with St. Clair named special counsel to the President, and Buzhardt and Garment removed from active direction of the Watergate defense. One side of Barker's face is paralyzed, which he says was caused by exposure to cold while he was digging a ditch at Eglin a week or ten days ago; doctor there diagnosed it as Bell's palsy.
