Ford (Nixon) - "Vice President Gerald R. Ford express confidence after meeting with President Nixon [today] that the House would not vote to impeach the President. There was a 'possibility' that the House Judiciary Committee would vote a bill of impeachment, he said, but he felt 'strongly' that the House would reject it because the 'preponderance of the evidence favors the President.'

"The meeting, at San Clemente, Calif., was Ford's sixth with Nixon that week.\* Ford attributed the meetings to Nixon's desire to have the Vice President play an active role in the Administration's fight against inflation. The July 13, session was devoted '99.9%' to economic problems, Ford told reporters afterwards."
