Nixon (GOP) - "A former Nixon administration cabinet officer whose friendship with the former President is still strong private grumbles: 'For the life of me, I can't understand Barry Goldwater anymore. He goes to see Nixon for a short time and comes away saying Dick might have a future in the Republican Party. Barry knows our friend is gone forever from power in the party. He's finished, kaput, and nobody knows it better than Dick. He knows he'd hurt us tremendously if he tried any kind of a comeback. God knows we're hurting enough.'"
