Operation Leprechaun - UPI gives Elsa Suarez's name as Elsa Guitierrez.

Miami Herald says Operation Leprechaun grew out of a joint investigation by the IRS and the Justice Department's Organized Crime Strike Force, with quotations from Dougald McMillan, Miami-based regional director of the strike force, and Leon Levine, IRS operations chief in WX. McMillan says the IRS and the strike force collaborated in 1972 "in an intelligence-gathering operation aimed at corruption and organized crime," and that "The last thing we were interested in were the sex lives of anybody" Levine says that "The preliminary indications are very much that not only what turned out to be Operation Leprechaun, but perhaps a good bit of the entire investigative project that was envisioned, really came out of the strike force," and that the focus of the IRS was on tax-related matters.

Gerstein says he will take the matter before the Dade county grand jury.

Nixon's assassination planned by KGB - "The Soviet KGB had a contingency plan to kill Richard Nixon if he had been elected President in 1960, a high Russian intelligence officer has told the CIA." The informant is said to be Anatol Golytsyn, a former KGB major who defected to the U.S. from post in Helsinki "in the early 1960s." "Golytsyn's own view was that the plan, although bizarre, was deadly serious. He attributed it to the late Nikita Khrushchev

"For years, Golytsyn's spectacular revelations have been hidden away in the CIA's files. But after stories about the CIA's assassination attempts were revealed, CIA sources confided Golytsyn's KGB assassination tales to us."
