Hughes said he ordered the audit because of possible links between committee financing and the break-in and alleged bugging of Democratic headquarters on June 17.

Sen. William Proxmire (D-Wis.) wrote the congressional watchdog agency earlier yesterday requesting the probe after the Washington Post reported on the \$25,060 check.

The audit is the first undertaken by the GAO after it gained such power under a new campaign spending law that took effect April 7.
