

McCord's Lawyer May Quit

WASHINGTON (AP) —

James W. McCord's lawyer, Gerald Alch, is reported ready to quit because he thinks a new attorney in the case is making McCord into a political patsy to embarrass President Nixon.

One of McCord's lawyers already has resigned because of the sudden appearance of Bernard Fensterwald, an independently wealthy Washington lawyer who once headed a celebrated wiretapping investigation.

Fensterwald, a Democrat, reportedly put up \$40,000 toward McCord's \$100,000 bond.

One source said he believes Fensterwald's motive "is to see the White House scream," and that McCord is going along because he is eager "to tell of his own limited involvement in the planning of the Democratic headquarters bugging."

Fensterwald called the reports "sheer nonsense."
