

Nixon Goes Off To Camp David

With the Watergate case swirling steadily nearer to the White House, President Nixon canceled a scheduled meeting with his chief economic advisers and flew off last night to his mountain-top Camp David retreat.

The President decided, apparently on short notice, to spend the full weekend at his secluded retreat in the

Maryland mountains.

White House aides said Mr. Nixon went to Camp David without such key advisers as H. R. Haldeman and John Ehrlichman, two assistants whose names have been linked with the steadily expanding Watergate developments.

In his journey through a rainy night, the chief executive was accompanied by only his military aide and Secret Service agents.
