## Judge Questions Cash in Purse Of Hunt's Wife

ROCKVILLE, Md. (AP) — A convicted water rate conspirator, E. Howard Hunt, failed to satisfy a Maryland judge's questions about the \$10,585 found in his wife's purse after a Chicago plane crash last December.

The matter is now being un-  
der review in the settlement of  
Hunt's estate, which is being  
administered by William F. Scott,  
judge of the Montgomery County  
Circuit Court.

The judge said Tuesday that  
Hunt's wife, Mrs. Hunt, who  
was named March 16, was  
asked to be removed as executrix  
of the estate of conspirator Wil-  
liam F. Buckley.

Convicted criminals are dis-  
abled by Maryland law from  
serving as executors. "When  
Mr. Hunt pleaded guilty, it was  
my duty to refer the matter to  
the court," she said.

Judge Ralph Sauer of the  
Montgomery County Circuit  
Court subsequently ordered  
Hunt or his son to show cause  
why he should not be removed  
as executor after Buckley filed  
a petition asking to be named  
to the task.

In a reply filed March 16,  
Hunt asked to be removed and  
submitted the required account-  
ing, Mrs. Scott said.

The judge rejected Hunt's ac-  
counting because it did not in-  
clude the money found in Mrs.  
Hunt's purse after the United  
Air Lines jet crashed at Mid-  
way Airport Dec. 3, Mrs. Scott  
said.
