

# Nixon Goes to Florida-- Planning Staff Changes

Key Biscayne, Fla.

President Nixon flew to Florida yesterday ready to add new names to a White House staff roster being shuffled after the resignations of H. R. Haldeman and John D. Ehr-

lichman.

Indications were that Mr. Nixon already has decided upon interim steps to fill the vacuum left by the departure Monday of his closest aides. Announcement of his decision is expected within a

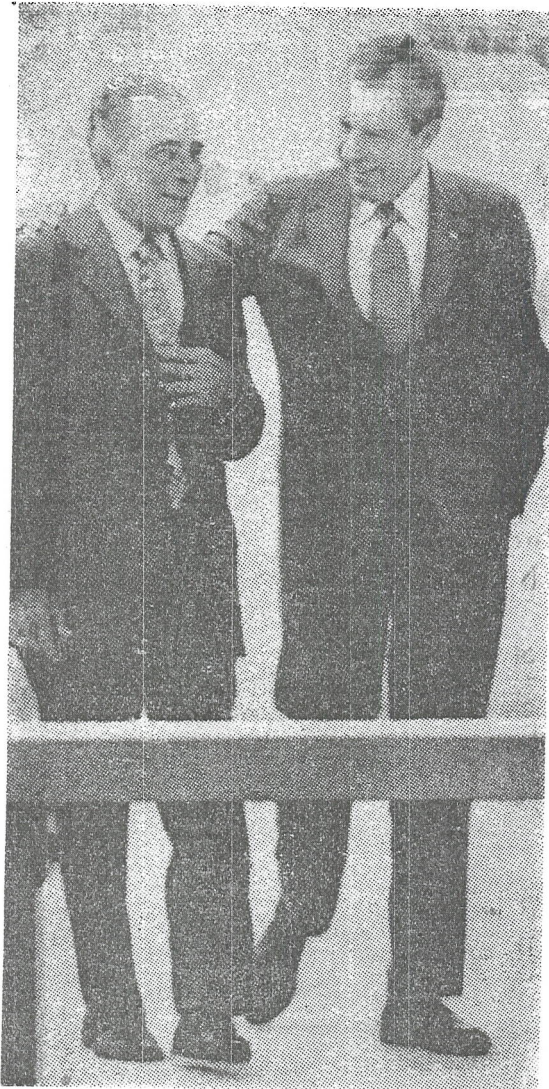
few days.

Before leaving the White House yesterday for the two-hour flight to his bay-side home here, Mr. Nixon conferred with a number of his advisers on how the White House would operate without Haldeman, who was chief of staff, and Ehrlichman, who was the President's chief domestic adviser.

Sources said Kenneth Cole, director of the Domestic Council, had taken up some of Ehrlichman's duties and that Stephen Bull and David Parker had temporarily assumed the scheduling and paperwork chores of Haldeman.

Aides said the President would spend some time this weekend on the question of staff changes, and catching up on his rest after a hectic week in Washington.
