

Nixon Medic Tells Burglary

LONG BEACH — (AP) — A former personal physician to President Nixon says Nixon's medical records were taken from a safe in his office and "obviously scrutinized" during the 1972 presidential campaign.

Dr. John Lungren, according to the copyright story in the Long Beach Independent, Press Telegram today, said his office was burglarized twice last September and the Nixon records were taken from a safe and scattered on the floor.

Lungren, a heart specialist and internist, said he last

examined Nixon in 1969 and is now a "medical consultant" to the President.

Police who investigated said \$27 was taken in the first burglary. Lungren said the unlocked safe in which he kept the Nixon records had been ransacked but the records apparently were not disturbed the first time.

In the second burglary, Lungren said, the Nixon medical records were obviously disturbed although nothing else, including money plainly visible, was taken.

"I don't believe that any

of the records are missing, but the papers were out of chronological order and obviously scrutinized," Lungren was quoted as saying. "There is the supposition that they might have been photographed."

Lungren said he notified the White House of the burglaries.

"A number of FBI agents came to the office and I believe there was a combined investigation by the FBI and the local police," he added.

"I have no idea of what value the Nixon records could be to anyone.
