Liddy Takes Jail Rather Than Talk

WASHINGTON — (UPI)
— Watergate conspirator G.
Gordon Liddy is still maintaining his silence about the bugging case and is "going up the river alone," according to one of his attorneys.

Thomas Kennelly said yesterday that Liddy has once again refused to follow his advice and tell a grand jury

about the plot.

"Mr. Liddy's position remains unchanged — He is not implicating anybody,"

Kennelly said. "He is, as I have said before, going up

the river alone."

Kennelly said government prosecutors unsuccessfully attempted to convince Liddy to change his mind about testifying before the grand jury investigating the break-in and bugging of the Democrats' Watergate building headquarters.

Meanwhile, Judge John J.
Sirica, the Watergate trial judge, denied Kennelly's request to withdraw as one of Liddy's attorneys because his advice was not being

heeded.
