

FOUR NIXON EX-AIDES

NAMED IN LAWSUIT

SAN FRANCISCO, May 18 (UPI)—A \$220,000 political lawsuit was filed today against John N. Mitchell, Maurice H. Stans, Donald H. Segretti, Herbert W. Kalmbach and the Committee for the re-election of the President by two campaign staff members for former Senator Eugene J. McCarthy.

The suit, filed in San Francisco Superior Court, accused the four former Nixon aides of being involved in "theft and

forgery" of McCarthy material for the June 8, 1972, presidential primary in California.

The suit was filed by Jonathan J. Wilcox, a San Francisco lawyer and chairman of the California Committee for McCarthy, on his own behalf and that of Barbara Barron a McCarthy committee member.

The suit charged that the four men had been involved in the theft and forgery of McCarthy campaign stationery.

Mr. Segretti and two John Does were accused of stealing envelopes and letterheads from the McCarthy headquarters.

Letters were typed on the stationery above the forged signature of Barbara Barron and mailed out, the suit said.
