## Mrs. Mitchell Urges Husband to Tell All About Watergate

WASHINGTON, June 20 (UPI) — Mrs. John N. Mitchell said today that she was urging her husband to disclose whatever he knows about White House involvement in the Watergate scandal, no matter who is concerned, and that she still thinks President Nixon should resign.

"I don't like Vice President Agnew, but by God I think he's better than Nixon," she added.

Mrs. Mitchell, whose husband was Attorney General and President Nixon's re-election campaign manager until last July, said she wanted him to provide any information he had for the sake of their family.

"I've told him repeatedly that I may not be here many years, but Marty [their daughter] will be and his grandchildren," she said in a telephone interview in New York City to Helen Thomas, a White House reporter for U.P.I.

Mrs. Mitchell also said she was "going south" for the summer with her daughter because "all I want is peace of mind."

She added that her husband would join them later and that she would stick by him in the days ahead, when he faces questioning by the Senate Watergate committee and a trial in New York on charges that he sought to obstruct justice and defraud the Government in connection with a campaign contribution.
