## McCloskeyAccuses Nixon Of Violating Oath of Office

WASHINGTON June 26 (UPI)—Representative Paul N. McCloskey r., Republican of California, aid last night that President Nxon had violated his oath of office by ordering creation of in extralegal intelligence unit directed by the White House He did no say that impeachment procedings should be started, but he did propose a House inquiy as the first step toward posible impeachment proceedings.

He said that all the evidence gathered by the Senate Watergate committee and the Watergate committee and the Watergate grand jury should be made available to the House Judiciary Committee so it could begin its inquiry without spending momths duplicating other investigations.

Mr. Nixon has admitted authorizing on July 15, 1970, a "decision memorandum" that called for tampering with the United States mails and burglary where necessary, supposedly to gather "priority foreign intelligence" in the interest of "internal security."
