

6 EX-CAMPAIGN AIDES GIVEN JOBS AT F.T.C.

WASHINGTON, July 12 (UPI)—Six former employes of President Nixon's re-election committee have been given high-ranking jobs at the Federal Trade Commission, it was disclosed today.

The agency listed those involved at the request of Representative Harley O. Staggers, Democrat of West Virginia, who wanted the information as part of a study being made by a special investigations subcommittee.

The six persons formerly employed by the Committee for the Re-election of the President are:

Michael H. Abrams, who helped organize the Jewish vote; he is now a lawyer in the office of the F.T.C.'s general counsel.

Peter P. L. Broccolelli, who was an aide to a top campaign strategist; he is now a trial attorney in the Bureau of Consumer Protection.

Theodore J. Garrish, who worked for the committee's polling and public opinion operation; he, too, is a lawyer for the Bureau of Consumer Protection.

Arthur L. Amolsch, 2d, who was the chief speechwriter and news bureau manager for the re-election committee; he is the F.T.C.'s public information director.

John Fuller, who worked under Mr. Amolsch as a writer; he is now a speechwriter in the F.T.C.'s information office.

Martha H. Duncan, who was an office manager for the re-election committee; she is now a personal assistant to Lewis A. Engman, chairman of the F.T.C.
