## Phone Company Insisting White House Obey Rules

A company spokesman said an inquiry on the subject had been sent to the White House in response to a Federal Communications Commission request for an investigation by the American Telephone and Telegraph Company, the parent corporation.

A.T. & T. Tariff No. 263 provides that any recording equipment used by telephone customers must include a device that emits an audible tone at 15-second intervals when the recording device is operating. It has been testified that Mr. Nixon's phones had no such warning.
