

Nixon, Following Orders To Relax, Goes Swimming

CAMP DAVID, Md., July 29
(AP) — President Nixon spent today in the seclusion of his mountaintop retreat, and aides reported that he was following his doctor's orders to relax by swimming and taking walks along wooded paths.

None of the President's principal aides or advisers were with him, only his wife and a friend, Charles G. Rebozo.

A White House spokesman said the President was spending time during the weekend preparing for a meeting tomorrow with Australian Prime Minister Gough Whitlam and sessions Tuesday and Wednesday with Japanese Premier Kakuei Tanaka.

Asked whether the President had spent any of the weekend on Watergate-related matters, the spokesman replied, "I don't believe he has."
