

Haldeman Named in N.C. Suit

CHARLOTTE, N.C., Aug. 9 (UPI)—An attorney for the Charlotte police department Wednesday filed motions with a federal court asking that former White House aide H. R. Haldeman be added to the list of defendants in an \$840,000 damage suit against police and the Secret Service.

"If it's allowed by Judge (James B.) McMillan, he will be added to the defendants in the lawsuit," said attorney Frank Aycock. Aycock said he was also asking that White House advance man William Henkle be named as a defendant in the action.

McMillan, he said, is expected to rule on the issue by the end of the month.

"What we have done is file motions to allow us to plead cross-claims against the Secret Service and file third party complaints against Haldeman and Henkle," he said.

Fourteen persons have filed the suit, claiming they were illegally thrown out of a Presidential appearance at "Billy Graham" Day ceremonies here in October, 1971.

Aycock Tuesday asked the court to allow the police department to hold Haldeman and the Secret Service liable for any payment the department might have to make as a result of the suit.
