73 Per Cent Rate Nixon Fair to Poor on Economy

Somewhat obscured in the roiling controversy Watergate is the fact that President Nixon continues to be in trouble with the public over his handling of the economy-on which he negative rating.

Just before his Phase IV program was announced, Mr. Nixon's rating on "keeping the economy healthy" was an even lower 75 to 20 per cent negative, the lowest recorded since he entered the White House.

Here is the trend of public answers to the question asked of a nationwide cross section of 1,497 households in mid-July:

"How would you rate President Nixon on keeping the economy healthy—excellent, pretty good, only fair, or poor?"
