

Rising Threat of the Presidency

Washington - (UPI) - A special senate subcommittee [the year-old Special Committee on the Termination of the National Emergency], after a painstaking computer search of the statute books, concluded yesterday the United States since 1933 has been operating under emergency rule, conferring near-authorization [authoritarian?] powers on its Presidents. Co-Chairmen Frank Church (D-Idaho), and Charles Mathias Jr., (R-Md), said in a foreword to the 607-page [study] that only a few delegated powers have been regularly used, but added: "It is possible that some future President could exercise this vast authority in an attempt to place the United States under authoritarian rule. While the danger of a Dictatorship arising through legal means may seem remote to us today, recent history records Hitler seizing control through the use of the emergency powers."
