Mansfield Sees Clean Politics Laws

WASHINGTON — (UPI)
— Senate Democratic leader
Mike Mansfield expressed
hope yesterday the Senate
Watergate Committee will
see its job through to the
end and recommend legislation to restore "some of that
old-time morality" to politics.

Mansfield noted published reports the Committee had become discouraged in its current study of campaign "dirty tricks" and might cut hearings short before its Nov. 1 deadline for a windup.

The television networks agreed to drop gavel to gavel to gavel coverage of the hearings after Wednesday's testimony by White House speech writer Patrick J. Buchanan, who Mansfield said was "a very aggressive, competent witness and more than held his own with the Committee."

"But the Committee must continue to fulfill its responsibilities." the Montana Democrat told reporters.
