

White House Calls Mostly Favorable

The White House, which steadfastly declined to characterize it following the weekend firing of Watergate special prosecutor Archibald Cox, volunteered last night that telephone callers were expressing overwhelming ap-

proval of President Nixon's television - radio news conference.

Deputy press secretary Gerald L. Warren said that, almost without exceptions, callers were voicing agreement with "one or another thing the President said."
