

Inouye Here--

Again Says Nixon Should Quit

Senator Daniel K. Inouye continued his harsh criticism of President Nixon here last night, repeating the contention that the Chief Executive should resign and be replaced by an "outstanding Republican."

The fiery Democrat from Hawaii said two possible replacements are Elliot Richardson, who resigned as Nixon's attorney general last week, or New York's Governor Nelson Rockefeller.

"When will this nightmare end?" he asked, repeating most of a speech he gave a week ago in Miami. He said the promised surrender of the tapes by the President to U.S. District Judge John J. Sirica "eases the crisis, but my request (for resignation) still stands."

Inouye spoke to 700 members of the Japanese American Citizens League at a dinner at the St. Francis Hotel.
