

Julie's View of Nixon Mood

Julie Nixon Eisenhower spoke of her father yesterday as a man who sometimes "gets very discouraged."

"Sometimes he doesn't even want to get up in the morning," she said. "But he is willing to go through any pain to do what he thinks is right."

She was here for ceremonies dedicating the Dwight D. Eisenhower Junior High School.

"I am upset over the mood of the country that questions my father ordering a military alert because of the Mideast crisis, and my father's health," she said during a news conference. "There have been too many major events in too

short a time for people to have time to judge.

"My father is not a man who has ever tried to hide anything," she added. "But the principle of confidentiality is crucial to the President. The people must have patience to judge for themselves about Watergate. The tapes will speak for themselves."
