

Watergate: Week Ahead

WASHINGTON, Oct. 28—

This week will see a number of actions in the many-faceted Watergate case. In addition to the expected naming of a new Watergate special prosecutor by Acting Attorney General Robert H. Bork, the following activities are also scheduled:

Monday

The Senate Judiciary Committee will hear from the former Watergate special prosecutor, Archibald Cox, while considering ways of setting up an office of special prosecutor.

A House Judiciary subcommittee meets to consider legislation to establish a special prosecutor's office.

A hearing is scheduled before Judge John J. Sirica on a plea for dismissal of charges against E. Howard Hunt Jr. and the four Miamians involved in the Watergate break-in.

Tuesday

White House officials meet with Judge Sirica to work out the court-ordered delivery of the Watergate tapes to Judge Sirica.

The House Judiciary Committee meets to establish ground rules for an inquiry into possible impeachment of President Nixon.

Wednesday

The Senate Watergate committee hearings resume, with witnesses yet to be announced.
