Nor had he been forced to accept U.S.Attorney General Elliot Richardson's resignation for refusing to fire Cox or felt compelled to fire Deputy Attorney General William Euckelshaus for likewise refusing to to do the firing. Congress had not yet been challenged.

Washington is far from Marin County. But the future of the American people and their government is going to be shaped by the grassroots concern on the local level. In this light, your active participation in the conference assumes even greater significance.
