

Daily's Call To Impeach

The Stanford Daily was one of 84 college newspapers that editorially called on Monday for the impeachment of President Nixon.

The editorial was written and circulated throughout the Nation by the Amherst Student and appeared simultaneously in such college papers as the Harvard Crimson, the Yale Daily News, the University of Chicago Maroon, the Michigan Daily, the Minnesota Daily and the MIT Tech. The college publications have a total circulation of nearly 700,000.

So far as is known, the Stanford officials said, none of the papers approached to run the "Impeach Nixon" editorial refused.

The editorial was written following the dismissal of Watergate special prosecutor Archibald Cox and the initial refusal of the President to turn over the Watergate tapes to U.S. District Judge John Sirica.

Coincidentally with appearance of the editorial in the Stanford Daily, it was announced by President Richard W. Lyman that Cox will be the speaker at Stanford's 83rd commencement exercises on June 16. He was the unanimous first choice of senior class officers.

Cox, a Harvard law professor who will spend next year at Cambridge University, is a former U.S. Solicitor General. His wife, the former Phyllis Ames, is a granddaughter of Nathan Abbott, first dean of the Stanford Law School.
