Krogh Goes on Trial Dec. 11  
In Ellsberg Break-In Case

WASHINGTON, Nov. 27 (UPI)—The former White House aide Egil Krogh Jr. will go on trial Dec. 11 on the charge that he lied under oath about the burglary by the White House "plumbers" at the California office of Dr. Daniel Ellsberg's former psychiatrist.

United States District Court Judge Gerhard A. Gesell said today that he expected the jury trial to last a week.

Mr. Krogh, who headed the White House has accepted responsibility but contends that he was acting lawfully in defense of national security at the time.

The burglary took place on the Labor Day weekend of 1971 and was aimed at obtaining psychiatric records of Dr. Ellsberg, who at the time was under indictment for leaking the Pentagon papers.
