A Uher Universal 5000 tape recorder, the same model as the one used by Miss Woods. In testimony in Federal Court, the President's personal secretary said she may be responsible for part of the erasure because she inadvertently pressed the record button, third from right, instead of the stop button, fourth from right, while at the same time she kept her foot on the treadle, shown in foreground. If her foot was not on the treadle at the time she pressed the record button, she would have had to press the start button, second from left, to erase tape.
